STUDENT CLUB ACTIVITIES

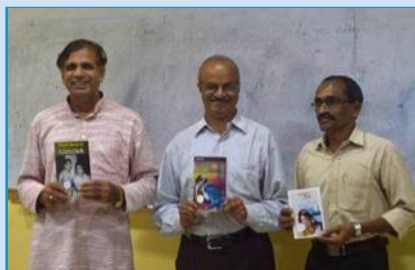
